America's first National Park is steeped in history. Yellowstone National Park offers a variety of firsts. Experience Old Faithful, the most popular geyser in the world. Look for wildlife in the Lamar Valley "America's Serengeti". Visit Bear World, no trip to Yellowstone is complete without taking this tour. Wildlife at Yellowstone Bear World roam in large, natural habitats, free to come right to the windows of your motorcoach. Imagine being face to face with a 1,000 pound grizzly.

Only a few miles south of Yellowstone, located in northwestern Wyoming, Grand Teton National Park preserves a spectacular landscape rich with majestic mountains, pristine lakes and extraordinary wildlife. The abrupt vertical rise of the jagged Teton Range contrasts with the horizontal sage-covered valley and glacial lakes at their base, creating world-renowned scenery that attracts millions of visitors each year.
