

Yellowstone, Glacier & Grand Teton National Parks

The Flathead Valley is the magnificent gateway to the west entrance of Glacier National Park – a park so naturally beautiful it is known as the “Crown Jewel of the Continent”. Visitors to Glacier National Park will enjoy the park’s one million acres of lakes, plunging valleys, and glacier-carved mountains. The park shares the World Heritage Site honour with the Taj Mahal in India, the Great Wall of China, the Great Barrier Reef of Australia and the Egyptian Pyramids. In this rugged section of the northern Rockies, exhilaration is the universal language. Mountain goats cling to craggy, glacier carved peaks and landscapes are so big and open and rugged that they stretch your soul. Along the way, don’t be surprised if resident wildlife shares the road with you.

America’s first National Park is steeped in history. Come make some of your own. In the middle of it all you’ll find more than you can imagine - room to breathe and geological wonders that are more spectacular than words can describe. Yellowstone National Park offers a variety of other firsts. Experience Old Faithful, the most popular geyser in the world, and hundreds of other geysers and hot springs. Look for wildlife in the Lamar Valley “America’s Serengeti”. Watch as steaming geysers erupt in all their glory or at first light you can view bear, bison, elk and wolf as they cross over miles of untouched landscape. The experiences are timeless. Just what you’d expect from a place

where little has changed since it opened over 135 years ago. We invite you to come enjoy over 2 million acres of steaming geysers, thundering waterfalls, crystalline lakes, and panoramic vistas.

Only a few miles south of Yellowstone, located in northwestern Wyoming, Grand Teton National Park preserves a spectacular landscape rich with majestic mountains, pristine lakes and extraordinary wildlife. The abrupt vertical rise of the jagged Teton Range contrasts with the horizontal sage-covered valley and glacial lakes at their base, creating world-renowned scenery that attracts millions of visitors each year.

Find out why Lewis and Clark described Montana as, “scenes of visionary enchantment”. Life here is guided by nature. Breathtaking sunsets stretch over prairies that seem to go on forever. Snow-capped peaks form a backdrop for rolling hills. Swift streams tumble over rocky beds, while placid rivers cut through ancient inland seas. The sky is bigger, the vistas dramatic, and complete strangers wave hello. Follow the scenic highway and byways, through charming communities, and discover what the Blackfeet call the “Backbone of the World”.
